



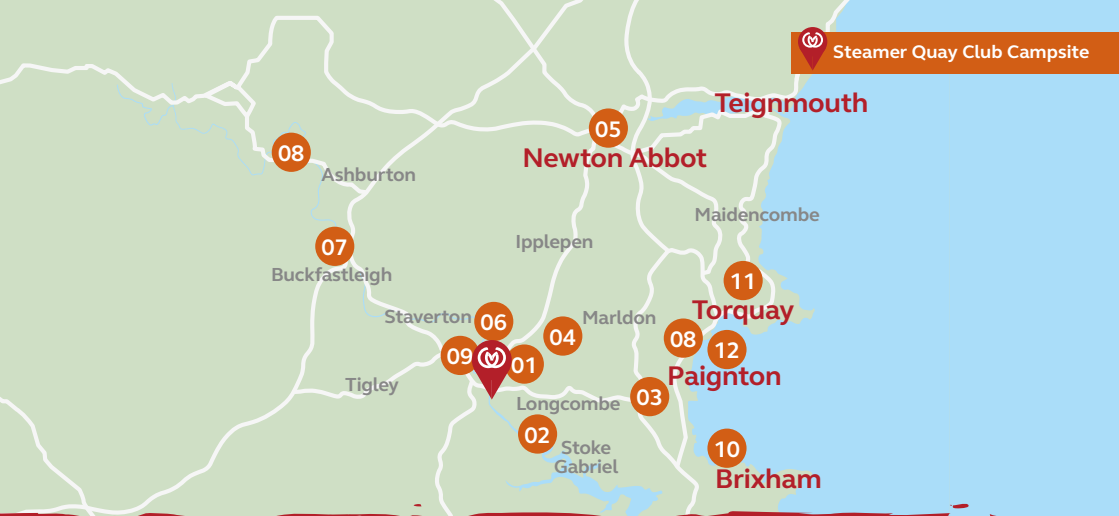

Totnes is along the Dart Valley cycle way, a 7 mile off-road cycle path from Dartington to Ashprington. This forms part of the National Cycle Network, route 2, Okehampton to Plymouth.

10 Brixham

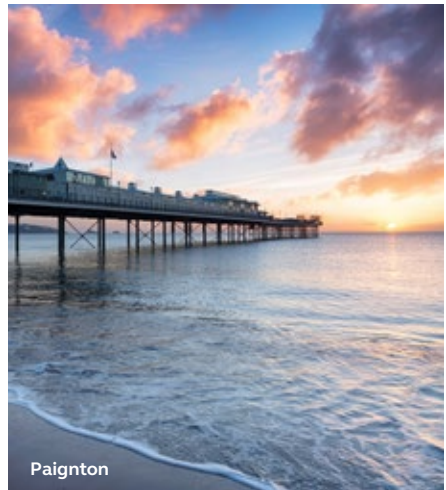
A charming and characterful town home to unique attractions, excellent arts and rich culture.

Visitor's top tips

|| The river dart cruise to Dartmouth is worth doing & is around a 5 minute walk.

The Round Robin is a must. A full day out with three trips all in one; boat, steam train and bus; visiting Dartmouth, Kingswear and Paignton

The walk from site along the riverbank is very scenic and isn't strenuous.

You must try a pasty, and a Devon Cream Tea!

Totnes has a beautiful high street filled with quirky shops to browse and lovely dog-friendly cafés.

Stoke Gabriel offers spectacular views!

There are plenty of places to eat near to site, whether it's a cosy pub or an elegant riverside bistro. Totnes also has four microbreweries.

The Sharpham Vineyard is a scenic hour-long walk (or cycle) from site, offering tastings of classic English wines. It also has a lovely cafe and sells delicious hand-made cheeses.

We loved visiting the National Trust sites in the area – our favourites were Compton Castle and Greenway House.

If you have time, definitely make a visit to Exeter or Plymouth. **||**
