



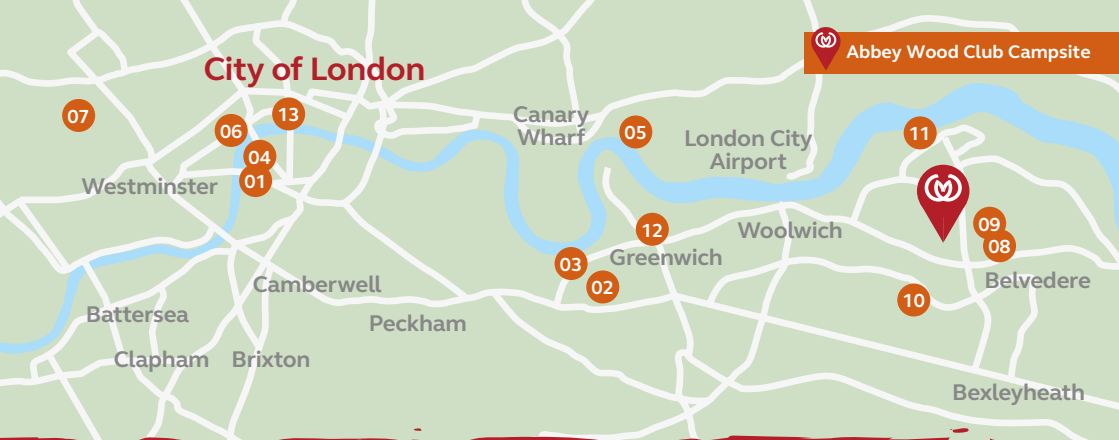

- 1 The London Eye**

The best place for spectacular 360-degree views of London's famous landmarks.
- 2 Old Royal Observatory**

Stand on the Greenwich Meridian Line and explore the history of time and astronomy.
- 3 Cutty Sark**

Discover what life was like on board Cutty Sark, the world's only surviving tea clipper, and fastest ship of her time.
- 4 The London Dungeons**

Take a walk through London's gruesome history as you experience the Dungeon's shows and rides.
- 5 Emirates Cable Car**

Enjoy sweeping views across London from the Greenwich Peninsula to the Royal Docks.

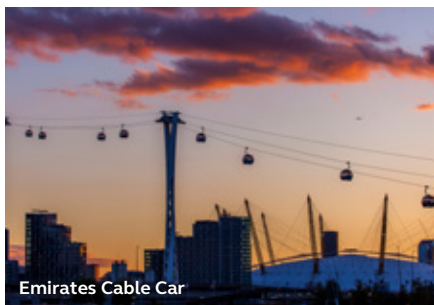

- 6 Up at the O2**

Ascend to the top of The O2 via a walkway, suspended 52m above ground level.
- 7 Thames Rib**

The most thrilling way to see London's Landmarks as you experience the river Thames by RIB Speedboat.

## Cycle

### 10 Local routes

A mixture of on-road and traffic-free routes surround the site Greenwich and the neighbouring Borough of Bexley have a great selection of parks that are ideal for cycling.

### 11 National Cycle Network

The nearest route is The Thames Path which is part of Route 1.

## Walk

### 8 Green Chain

This group of walks includes a section from Lesnes Abbey to the Thames Path.

### 9 Lesnes Abbey Park

The park has over 69 hectares of ancient woodland and the ruins of the 12th Century Abbey to explore.



## Explore

### 12 Greenwich

Home to some of the nations most famous sights including the Meridian Line, O2 arena and Royal Observatory, this is one of London's most historically-rich boroughs and is also a UNESCO listed site.

### 13 Central London

Step into the thriving heart of London and discover an exciting mix of tradition, diverse culture and historical treasures.



## Visitor's top tips


It's a short walk to Abbey Wood Station, where you can jump on the Elizabeth line – a fantastic way to get into central London quickly! We use our contactless debit/credit card when travelling in London for just a day or two; the total spend is capped no matter how far you travel in a day.

Borough Market is an excellent place to go and explore for food heaven! It's a short walk from London Bridge station.

If you're eating out visit [bookatable.co.uk](http://bookatable.co.uk) and [opentable.co.uk](http://opentable.co.uk) for some great deals. You might even find deals for Michelin starred restaurants.

The Sky Garden or 'Walkie Talkie' building is free to go up, you get great views of The Shard on the opposite side of the river. Book in advance online.

A lovely alternative way to get into London is by taking the bus or train to Greenwich and travelling into London along the Thames. You can board either a Thames Clipper (water taxi) or a City Cruise behind the Cutty Sark. Both are available as offers on the 2 for 1 attractions with a travelcard.

We took a boat trip up to Westminster (70 mins) crossed Westminster bridge, walked along the South Bank, had lunch and got a boat back to Greenwich from just past the Tate Modern.
