



- 1 Leave the Caravan Park and turn left you will see the cycle sign. Head straight on at the crossroads along Point Road.
- 2 At the junction bear right at signpost to Penpol. Follow the road, catching views of Carrick Roads and the Fal River on the left. Keep straight on until you see the steep hill sign.
- 3 Turn right at signpost to Devoran. Continue along the road, down the hill to the river.
- 4 At the T-junction turn right and follow the road parallel to the river. Take care along this single track section.
- 5 At the end of the single track turn left towards the Quay and continue along Quay Road. Alternatively, turn right at the end of the single track to head to the Devoran Inn for refreshments.
- 6 At the Devoran Village junction go straight on along Greenbank Road.
- 7 When the road bears right, you can see the cycle track ahead and follow the sign to Portreath.
- 8 Follow the cycle path to the next road crossing and carry straight on under the Carnon Viaduct (see the old pillars of Brunel's Wooden Viaduct).
- 9 At the next road crossing, turn right on to tarmac road.
- 10 At the crossroads go straight across. In 50 yards go straight across another crossroads. Pass over the ford via the bridge and continue uphill to the next crossroads.



11 Go straight across the Quenchwell Chapel crossroads.

- 12 Continue until just before the roundabout where you will see the cycle track on the right adjacent to the bollards.
- 13 Follow the track until the next roundabout. Turn left back to the Caravan Park.

#### DON'T MISS

**66** Good pub at Devoran - the Old Quay Inn good ales and great food.
