



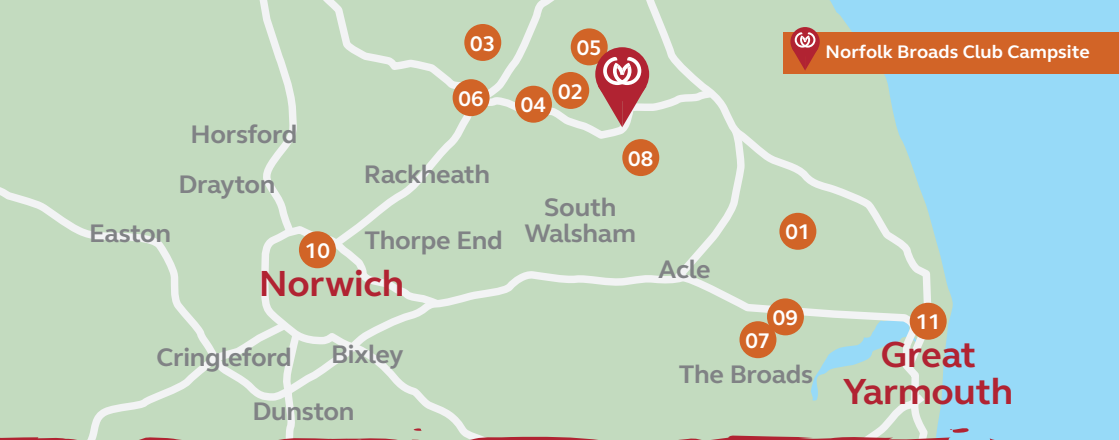

Home to a variety of rare and exotic animals with a unique network of raised walkways which allow for up-close viewing.

### 2 RAF Air Defence Radar Museum

Discover the history of radar and air defence in original 1942 buildings.

### 3 Wroxham Barns

See traditional crafts brought to life, bottle feed baby animals and enjoy some retail therapy.

### 5 Electric Eel Boat Trip

See stunning wildlife with a tour of How Hill National Nature Reserve.

### 6 Norfolk Broads Activity Centre

Hire canoes, stand up paddle boards and fishing boats, or go wild swimming or fungi foraging.





## Walk

### 7 The Broads National Park

Britain's largest protected wetland, with unique wildlife and over 190 miles of footpaths and nature trails.

### 8 Local Walks

Local booklets are available in reception. There is a 3 mile circular walk from the site's entrance which takes in the River Ant and St Benet's Abbey.

## Explore

### 10 Norwich

The most complete medieval city in the UK, with winding streets and over 1500 historical buildings. It also has a flourishing arts and music scene, superb shops, and plenty of restaurants and bars.

### 11 Great Yarmouth

For a fun filled, family day visit Great Yarmouth's long, sandy beach, enjoy Pleasure Beach and Joyland's amusement parks or see sharks in Sea Life's Aquarium.

## Visitor's top tips

|| From Wroxham you can take canoe trips on the River Bure, a fabulous experience!

We enjoyed a day at Horsey Beach and saw many seals playing in the sea.

The New Inn in Horning has good food and overlooks the Broads.

This site is ideally placed for visits to many local spots, Norwich, Great Yarmouth and Cromer just for starters.

Walk along the river to How Hill, about 45 mins, where you'll find a cafe with very welcomed tea and cake.

Visit the World of Miniature Railways to see a collection of stunning working model railways.

Visit Bridgestones Cafe in Potter Heigham, home cooked food and dog friendly.

Walk up the river to lovely How Hill and you can see the Marshmans Cottage. You can also go on a boat trip tour on the nature reserve.

The Dog Inn is a good local pub with nice food and friendly staff. ||

## Close by

### Supermarkets

There is a small shop at Ludham Bridge, Throwers in Ludham Village also offers a post office and groceries. The historic Roys of Wroxham store is 5 miles from site and there is a Tesco in Stalham, 7 miles away.

In Norwich, 10 miles.

### Petrol station

Murco in Ludham Village 1.5 miles, Jet 5.7 miles from site.

### Cashpoint

Nearest cashpoint is in Throwers in Ludham Village 1.5 miles from site.

### Swimming pool

In Norwich, 10 miles.

### Tourist Information

In Wroxham.

### Public transport

A request bus stop is 70 yards from the site entrance – a timetable is available from our information room. There is a park & ride into Norwich from Sprowston, 10 miles from the site on the A1151. Taxis from site are usually pet friendly.
