



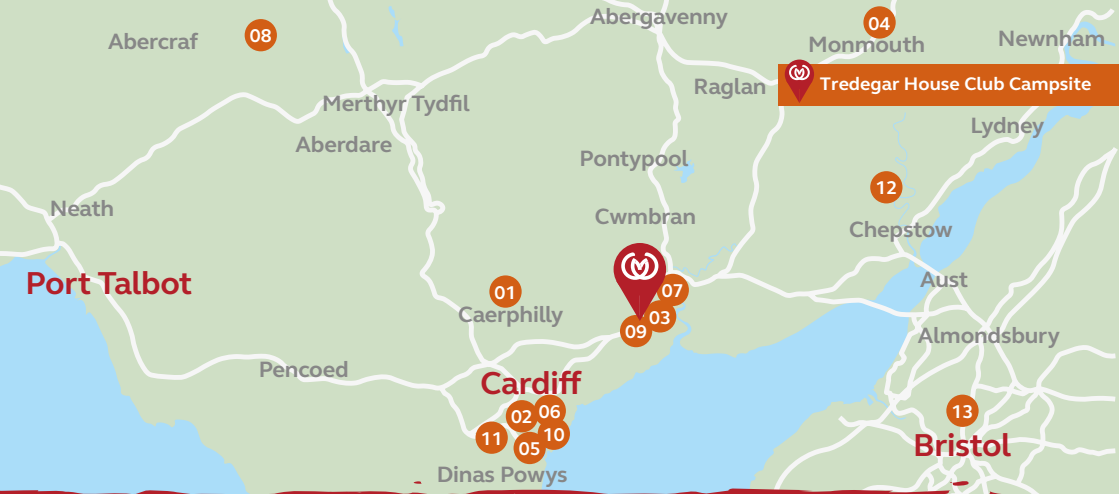

### 9 National Cycle Network

The Country Park has 90 acres of parkland, providing woodland walks or a stroll around the lake.

### 11 Cardiff

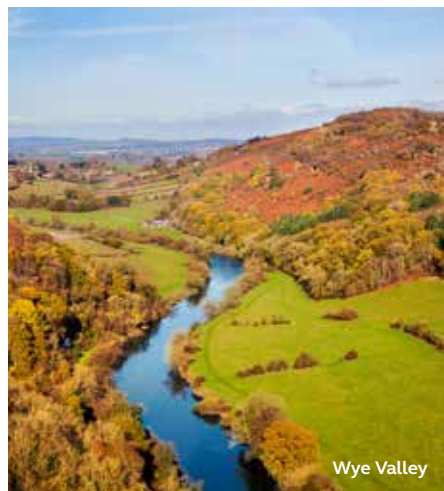
The site is perfectly placed for visiting Wales' historic and vibrant capital.

## Visitor's top tips

Take a day out to explore the Brecon Beacons – beautiful scenery and plenty to explore!

The Transporter Bridge is one of two working ones of its kind in UK and one of only eight in the world. It's well worth a visit.

Definitely visit Caerleon Roman ruins, we cycled there to see baths and museum.

The local pub The Dragonfly is really nice and serves food.

St. Fagans Museum of Welsh life was a fantastic day out.

There's a Parkrun at 9am on Saturday


mornings, as well as a junior run every Sunday morning.

RSPB Wetlands, Newport – a great place to walk, fun place for children, they allow dogs (on leads) and have a great café.

If you are interested in ancient churches, the Black Mountain valleys north of Abergavenny are a treasure trove amongst spectacular scenery.

The Big Pit and Castle Coch are worth a visit.

Visit Llandegfedd Lake for watersports (paddle boarding, windsurfing, kayaking, water zorbs) and open water swimming.

There's also fishing, trail walking and a lakeside cafe.
